

PONGAL: Referred as Thai pongal is a multi-day harvest festival observed in south-India particularly in Tamil community observed particularly at the start of month Tai according to Tamil solar calendar which is typically about 14th January every year.



ONAM: It's a harvest festival celebrated by Malayalis date is based on panchangam and falls on the 22nd nakshtra thiruvonam in the month chingam of Malayam calendar which in Gregorian calendar overlaps with august-September, it's an annual festival celebrated in the Indian state of Kerala.

Offline quiz:




